THE CERTIFICATE IN CHINESE STUDIES

The Certificate in Chinese Studies consists of eighteen (18) credit hours in Chinese Studies or related courses approved by the program director (6 credit hours must be completed on the IUPUI campus). Courses at the 100-level do not count toward the Certificate.

Certificate requirements include a minimum of three (3) credits in Chinese language at the 200-level or above; a minimum of three (3) credits in Chinese culture at the 300-level or above (either EALC E 334 or E 335); and the remaining credits in Chinese language, culture, history, and/or society chosen from the following:

**Course E 351(Studies in East Asian Culture) must be exclusively on Chinese culture and H421 (Topics in African, Asian, or Latin American History) must be exclusively on Chinese history in order for these two courses to be counted towards the fifteen required credits for the minor.

THE MINOR IN CHINESE STUDIES

The minor in Chinese Studies consists of fifteen (15) credit hours in Chinese Studies or related courses approved by the program director (6 credit hours must be completed on the IUPUI campus). Courses at the 100-level do not count toward the certificate. Certificate requirements include a minimum of three (3) credits in Chinese language at the 200-level or above; a minimum of three (3) credits in Chinese culture at the 300-level or above (either EALC E334 or E335); and the remaining credits in Chinese language, culture, history, and/or society (The list of courses for the minor is the same as for the certificate).

INDIVIDUALIZED MAJOR IN CHINESE

TRANSITION TO TEACHING PROGRAM

Students with a B.A. in Chinese who have completed their teaching major requirements in Chinese can earn an accelerated Teacher Certification in 12 months with the School of Education. Contact an advisor in the School of Education or the Chinese Program Director.

LANGUAGE PLACEMENT

All non-native students with previous knowledge of Chinese are urged to take the appropriate placement test to assess their level of proficiency. Students may test out of first and/or second year of course work and qualify for special credits at a reduced fee after successfully completing the IUPUI course into which they are placed.

To schedule a placement assessment, contact the Director of the Chinese program.

Programs abroad are open to students majoring in all academic disciplines and are not restricted to language majors.
