### WHY CLASSICAL STUDIES?

Classical Studies is an interdisciplinary field examining the vanished civilizations of ancient Greece and Rome. Today the art, literature, and intellectual traditions of the classical world stand at the heart of Western civilization. Students will encounter the classical world through the many fine translated texts available, the physical evidence of art and archaeology, and the study of the Greek and Latin languages. Students of Classics learn to think and read critically, write professionally, and connect with cultures different than their own. Come explore the societies that gave us democracy, theater, Republican government, professional armies, and so much more.

### THE MINOR IN CLASSICAL STUDIES

The Minor in Classical Studies consists of at least 15 credit hours in classical archaeology, classical civilization, ancient Greek, Latin, or related courses approved by the Program Director.

Students may wish to design concentration areas of particular interest (e. g., classical art and archaeology, or Greek or Roman civilization). At least 6 credit hours must be taken at the 300 level or higher; with no more than 3 credit hours drawn from ancient Greek or Latin at the 100 level. Up to 6 credit hours may be taken in related fields, including History C386, C388, and Philosophy P307. Minors in ancient Greek or Latin should include at least 12 credit hours in the language at the 200 level or higher, and 3 credit hours in a related culture or history course. (6 credit hours must be completed on the IUPUI campus.)

### THE INDIVIDUALIZED MAJOR IN CLASSICAL STUDIES

Students may design a Major in Classical Studies through the Individualized Major Program.

The Individualized Major requires a minimum of 34 credit hours. Two courses are required of all students:

- I360 Individualized Major Plan (1 credit hour)
- I460 Individualized Major Senior Project (3 to 6 credit hours)
